Main challenges in the area of pesticides residues (1)

MRL setting under Regulation (EC) No. 396/2005

- Evaluation of new applications to set or modify specific MRLs (Art. 10)
- Management of unforeseen situations: Substances regulated under Reg. 396/2005 are found in food at levels above the MRL, but do not necessarily originate from pesticides use
- Review of existing MRLs for 330 substances in 316 commodities (Art.12 review)





Main challenges in the area of pesticides residues (1)

MRL setting under Regulation (EC) No. 396/2005

- Art. 12 review: LOQs are updated
 - Input from EFSA and EU RLs
 - EU RLs take into account the LOQs that are feasible for a majority of the labs
 - 2 different LOQs in 1 commodity group
 - New or updated analytical methods provided by EU RLs





Main challenges in the area of pesticides residues (1)

MRL setting under Regulation (EC) No. 396/2005

- Art. 12 review: residue definitions are updated
 - Input from EU RLs in stage of draft reasoned opinion
 - Footnote that standards should be made available
 - Inclusion of salts in the residue definition





Main challenges in the area of pesticides residues (2)

Cumulative risk assessment

- Reg. 396/2005
 - Recital 6: 'It is also important to carry out further work to develop a methodology to take into account cumulative and synergistic effects'
 - Art. 14: 'When setting MRLs account shall be taken off their known cumulative and synergistic effects, when the methods to assess such effects are available'
- EFSA: development of a methodology for the assessment of multiple residues
- Acropolis group: development on-line IT tool
- COM: discussing on risk management issues by electronic working group of MS experts (2014)





Main challenges in the area of pesticides residues (2-3)

Endocrine disruptors

- Reg. (EC) 1107/2009 on plant protection products and Reg. (EU) No. 528/2012 on biocides require the setting of criteria to identify active substances with endocrine disrupting properties.
- COM is developing criteria to identify endocrine disruptors.
- Criteria may impact MRL and import tolerance setting





Main challenges in the area of pesticides residues (4)

Amendment of Reg. 396/2005

- Biocides
 - New draft Regulation on Biocides (DG ENV)
 - Amendment of Reg. 396/2005 to include residues of biocides beyond dualuse substances.
- Different MRLs set for one substance under different acts
 - Streamline procedures for adoption of MRLs
 - Clarifications concerning overlaps in legislation





Main challenges in the area of pesticides residues (5)

2015-2017 multiannual control programme of the Union

- Expert group meeting pesticides monitoring 04/10/2013
 - Input from MS, EU RLs, EFSA and FVO
- Draft Regulation SCOFCAH 18-19/11/2013
- Vote February 2014





Main challenges in the area of pesticides residues (5)

2015-2017 multiannual control programme of the Union

- Selection criteria for pesticides
 - Findings in previous monitoring programmes: risk based approach
 - New authorisations
 - Toxicity
 - Recent information on potential health risks
 - Analytical difficulty
- Selection criteria for commodities
 - Major components of the diet of the EU in 3-year cycles (consumer exposure assessment)





Main challenges in the area of pesticides residues (5)

2015-2017 multiannual control programme of the Union

- Food for infants and small children
 - Monitoring 2015 according to residue definition Reg. 396/2005
 - Reg. 609/2013 requires that Dir.2006/125 and 2006/141 on food for infants and small children will be replaced by delegated acts by July 2015
 - Residue definition of this legislation will be brought in line with Reg. 396/2005
 - Use of monitoring data to update Annex VI an VII of Dir.2006/125 and Annex VIII and IX of Dir. 2006/141.





FVO audits on pesticide controls: Member States

- 2007-2011: audit series on **pesticide residues** controls Overview Report published on SANCO homepage
- 2012-2014: audit series on controls for marketing and use of plant protection products (PPP); follow-up on recommendations for pesticide residues





- Audits targeted at countries with identified risk:
 - High trade volume
 - RASFF notifications
 - Member State control data via EFSA





- 2013-01: Morocco: mint and beans;
- 2013-04: Turkey: peppers
- 2013-10: China: tea
- 2013-11: Kenya: peas and beans





- 2014 priority: Thailand: brassica, aubergine, beans, basil and coriander leaves;
- 2014 priority: Vietnam: okra, pepper, basil, coriander leaves, mint and parsley;





- Focus FVO audits in Third Countries on tea, basil, coriander leaves, mint, parsley;
- These FVO audits are prioritised based on noncompliances identified by Member States;
- These commodities were included in Regulation 669/2009 on import controls;





FVO audits on pesticide controls: Task for NRLs

Ensure that:

- Laboratories designated for import controls are part of the national NRL networks;
- Analytical methods validated/accredited for tea, basil, coriander leaves, mint, parsley;
